Subj: Vision Configuration for Multiple Logins

Dear Precision Tester System Owner,

This document is intended for all users of Vision 4.x, regardless of the model of NGS tester, who will be using the tester on a host with multiple logins. Vision installs three registry entries that apply only to the user who is logged in when Vision is installed. These are Current User entries that must be updated under each login that is to use Vision.

Note that Vision installs a large variety of registry entries under the Current User registry key. However, only the three entries discussed in this document are required to launch Vision and operate it properly. The other entries may or may not already exist in the registry. But these three entries will need to be added by hand under each new login.

To start to update the registry go to Start->Run and type "regedit" in the dialog that appears.

A Registry Explorer will appear that resembles the standard Windows File Explorer program. Under the "My Computer" Root, entries in the first level of the program start with the "HKEY_..." label. The entries you will need to add will be under the HKEY_CURRENT_USER label key. (Folders are known as "keys" in the registry). The root path for all Vision entries will be HKEY_CURRENT_USER->Software->Radiant Technologies. The Software key will already exist. If the Radiant Technologies key does not exist, select the HKEY_CUR-RENT_USER->Software key, right-click and select New->Key from the popup menu.

The key will appear in the path and will be labeled "New Key #1". The label will be selected for renaming. Rename the key "Radiant Technologies".

If HKEY_CURRENT_USER->Software->Radiant Technologies already exists, the step is not necessary. In that case, there may already be several keys under HKEY_CURRENT_USER->Software->Radiant Technologies. If not, select the HKEY_CURRENT_USER->Software->Radiant Technologies key and repeat the above process to add HKEY_CURRENT_USER->Software->Radiant Technologies->boot and HKEY_CURRENT_USER->Software->Radiant Technologies->Settings. (Note that registry entries should not be case-sensitive. However, I have encountered installations in which case seems to matter. Please be sure that the keys and values are entered exactly as shown in these figures.)

The three entries that are critical to Vision are entered into these keys. If the keys already exist, then you may find that there are already entries – perhaps many of them – in the Settings key. Whether these are present or not is not of concern to this process. Select the KEY_CUR-RENT_USER->Software->Radiant Technologies->boot key. In the right-hand window, right-click and select New->String Value.

Rename the value New Value #1 -> DBTEMPLATE



Figure 6 – Name the String Value "DBTEMPLATE".

Double-click the DBTEMPLATE entry. In the Edit String dialog that appears, set the Value data: control to "C:\Program Files (x86)\Radiant Technologies\Vision\System\tdb.dst" and click OK. The value in the DBTEMPLATE entry will be updated to show the value.

Now, select the KEY_CURRENT_USER->Software->Radiant Technologies->Settings key. Using the steps above, add two String Values named HELPPATH and TASKLIBPATH. Set the data in these string values to:

- HELPPATH = c:\Program Files (x86)\Radiant Technologies\Vision\Help
- TASKLIBPATH = c:\Program Files (x86)\Radiant Technologies\Vision\system

Close the registry. Vision should now be ready to run

These steps should get any host that runs Vision under multiple logins properly updated to fully execute Vision under any login. In some cases in which systems have extraordinary network security, these steps have proven insufficient. In most of those cases, close work with the on-site network administrator has resolved the issue. In a few cases, the issue has only been resolved by installing Vision onto a new dedicated host that is not networked.
